## Albert Edward Chappell and Sarah Ann Bird

Albert Edward Chappell, a coachman, married Sarah Ann Bird on the 22 July 1893; Albert was born in London.

Sarah Ann grew up in Cotterstock, the daughter of William and Elizabeth Bird; her father was a shoemaker. She attended the school in the village which opened in 1872 after the Education Act of 1870.

Below is a photograph of the schoolroom, taken in 1924 with the children and their teacher Miss Phillips. It would have looked very similar in Sarah Ann's time.



Sarah Ann was living in Cottage No3 at the time of the 1881 Census with her parents, her brother Charles 23 a labourer, and her sisters Elizabeth 13, and Emily 6.

Almost exactly a year after their wedding in July 1894 Albert and Sarah had a son Albert and ten months later in May 1895 they had twin girls, May and Rose.

By the time of the 1911 census Albert, Sarah, their son Albert, daughter May and Albert's father Thomas are all living in Peterborough. Thomas is 77 and a widower, their son Albert 17 an engineer's clerk and their daughter May, just 15, working as a dressmaker for a lady's outfitter. We can see from the census return that they were living at 61 Percival Street in Peterborough.
