Saunders Quincey and Dorothy Gascoyne were married in St Andrew's on the 18th November 1827. Saunders signed the marriage register with a cross.

Saunders was the son of Thomas and Mary Quincey and Dorothy the daughter of Mary Gascoyne from Elton.

In the census of 1841 Saunders is listed as being 35 and an agricultural labourer. Dorothy is also 35 and at this time they have five daughters: Caroline 12, Maria 9, Mary-Ann 6, Betsy 4 and Sarah 1.

By the time of the 1851 census, they have two more children Emma 8, and Harriet who is 6; Dorothy's occupation is listed as a 'Beer Seller'. Saunders was obviously not at home at the time of the census as he isn't listed.

Saunders occupation is listed as "Beer House Keeper and Ag. Labourer" and Dorothy's as a "Beer House Keeper's Wife". They have their daughter Maria still living at home, she is 28 years old and a dressmaker.

Saunders died on the 6th December 1878 aged 74 years.

Dorothy died on the 22 June 1891 and she is buried with her husband Saunders in St Andrew's Churchyard.
